We are extremely pleased with these results which remain well above the national average, as well as showing an increase from our 2019 results. At Greater Depth, although we do not have as many achieving as in 2019, we still sit above the 2019 national average.

As we have reported this year, Writing is the area of learning that has seen the biggest Covid impact which is reflected in the results. However, we are proud to have achieved about the national average. Writing will continue to be a focus next year.

**Combined:**

In 2022, our combined score of children having met the national standard in Reading, Writing and Maths was **67%** compared to the national of **59%**. In 2023, our combined score is **58%** compared to **59%** nationally.

**Brooksward School Progress from KS1-2 July 2023:** (This information is released in the Autumn Term)

Progress for Year 6 pupils is calculated by comparing scaled scores from their end of Year 2 data (taken in 2019) with the scaled scores from their Year 6 test and teacher assessment data (2023). Expected progress would be 0.0, not enough progress would be a value less than 0.0 and children making more than expected progress would be a positive value.
