How to help your child at home


- Keep practising to write their name independently.

Topics

Autumn term 1: All About Me

Autumn term 2: Julia Donaldson

Reading and Writing

Within the first few weeks the children will be working on writing their names, using correct letter formation and working on using good pencil control. The children will be taught phonics every day in small 'Read Write Inc.' groups. They will begin to learn letter sounds and names and will begin to blend sounds to read simple words. After half term, we will be reading a range of Julia Donaldson stories and will learn about

the characters, rhyme and rhythm and sequencing

stories.

Maths

Number: The children will learn to reliably count objects. They will match and sort objects and start to compare amounts. We will look at the composition of numbers as well as number bonds to 5. We will also begin to introduce more and less.

Shape/Patterns: The children will learn to name and compare a variety of 2D shapes. We will also begin to copy, continue and make simple patterns using shapes.

Measure: The children will compare the size, mass and capacity of objects and use mathematical language such as large, small tall, short etc. We will also learn to use language to describe the positions of things e.g. behind, next to etc. The children will also explore the idea of night and day and talk about their daily routine.

Understanding of the world

During our topic 'All About Me' we will be talking about ourselves and our families, as well as learning about our new school community. In the second half term we will be learning about the Diwali festival and celebrations. We will also be learning about Christmas and the meaning of the nativity story.

Personal Social and Emotional

We will be learning about the class and school rules. We will also be building relationships and learning how to share and take turns fairly.



Communication and language

We will be learning to follow instructions correctly. We will also be listening attentively to stories and talking about key events.

Expressive arts and design

During the topic 'All About Me' we will be creating art based around ourselves. We will sing a variety of songs and we will play imaginatively in the home corner and doctors surgery. In the second half term we will explore colours and find out what happens when we mix them.



<u>P.E</u>

PE is taught by Coach Dave or Coach Culley. The children will be taught a range of skills through multiskills and also gymnastics. Please ensure that the children have the correct PE kit in school all week in case of any extra activities they complete.

PE kits should include: Plain white t-shirt, black PE shorts, black plimsolls for indoor PE and trainers for outdoor.
