Curriculum Information

Literacy

In the first half of this term, our Literacy and guided reading activities will be linked to 'The Romans' We will be developing our vocabulary, taking inspiration from the texts to create character descriptions, writing a myth, a recount of our Roman Day, writing persuasive adverts for a Roman Villa as well as an information text.

In the second half term, our Literacy learning will be linked to our topic and will involve information about

'The Rainforest'. We will write a non chronological report, a newspaper article, setting description as well as a story. We will also have the opportunity for some speaking and listening activities throughout the term too.

As well as having class-based Literacy lessons, the children will also take part in regular guided reading, spelling, grammar and handwriting sessions.

Please remember that children should be reading at least 4 times a week at home. This is very important as it helps improve children's accuracy when reading. They can read a range of books, magazines or comics to help them develop a love for reading.

Numeracy

Year 3: The children will start the autumn term by looking at num-

ber and the place value of 3 digit numbers. They will develop their fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills.

They will then be learning to use their mental and written methods for addition and subtraction, then applying these skills when solving problems. Also, they will be learning to use the 3, 4 and 8 times tables, then use these to solve problems. We will end the term with a topic on money using pounds and pence where they will add, subtract and solve problems.

Year 4: The children will start the autumn term by looking at number and the place value of 4 digit numbers. They will develop their fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills.

They will then be learning to use written methods for addition and subtraction, then applying these skills when solving two step word problems. Also, they will be learning to use the 6, 7 and 9 times tables as well as multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100, then use these to solve problems. We will end the term with a topic on length, perimeter and area.

Curriculum information continued

Science:

Year 3 will begin the term learning about a variety of rocks and soils as well as how to recognise and classify them. They will also learn about how fossils are formed linked to our key scientist for the term who is Mary Anning. In the second half term they will learn about skeletons and the link between bones and muscles.

Year 4 will begin by learning about living things and their habitats. This will involve looking at our key scientist, Chris Packham as well as the environments that various animals live in and how we can protect those areas. In the second half term they will be learning about teeth and skeletons as well as food chains and how our digestive system works.

<u>History/ Geography:</u> Our first topic has a history focus as we are learning about 'The Romans' which will look at who they were, what they built and why they invaded. In the second half of the term, our topic will have a geography focus and we will learn about South America. This will look at its location, weather and the rainforest.

<u>Art/DT:</u> In DT we will be creating a 'Siege Tower' which includes measuring and cutting wood as well as using gears and a pulley. During the second half of the term, we will base our work on 'The White Lipped Tree Frog' and focus on sketching with a pencil and using water colours.

RE: In RE lessons we will be looking at places of worship, festivals and celebrations. Some of this will focus on the Hindu and Muslim religions.

Musíc: Year 3 will work to use body percussions and explore a range of different sounds and Year 4 will work with a specialist teacher to play instruments.

<u>Computing:</u> Year 3 will learn how to use an animation program this term and Year 4 will learn how to create a maze game in the programme Scratch.

PSHE: Children will learn about healthy lifestyles and money.

French: Year 3 will learn how to greet others, count to 10, colours and days of the week.

Year 4 will learn how to ask simple questions and answer and finally taking part in a conversation. They will then learn about family members.


Homework
